Exchanges on cycling measures in Brighton



GPS-monitoring system in Iasi

Iasi is working on a range of measures to modernise public transport in the city. One of the components of this endeavour is a GPS system to track public transport vehicles.

The installation of GPS and GSM modules, antennas and accessories on 64 buses and 36 trams has almost been completed. Buses have also been equipped to monitor fuel consumption.

Travel at the speed of light in Aalborg

Cyclists travelling on the commuter route between the university and the city centre of Aalborg will now get through the Hadsundvej/ Humlebakken intersection much faster.

During the day, cyclists can follow a series of green lights lanes in the cycle path, indicating when the lights will be green in the intersection. In the evening, the cyclists themselves activate green lights at the intersection.

Hybrid bus in San Sebastian saves 30% fuel

San Sebastian has done measurements to compare the Lion City Hybrid with an EEV diesel bus. The results show that the hybrid saves 30 percent of fuel in average.

From June to September 2011, DonostiaBus has operated a pre-series model of the MAN Lions City Hybrid, and introduced the first serial produced Lions City Hybrid at the end of September.
